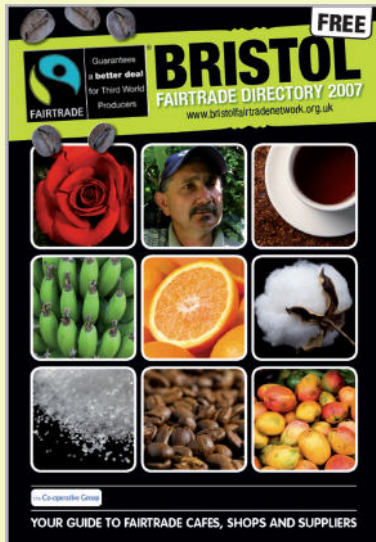

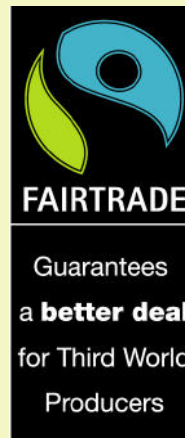

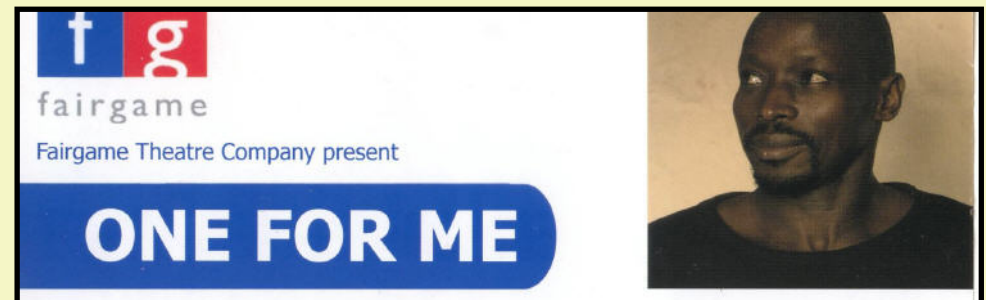
Bristol became a Fairtrade City in March 2005. Join us this year for these exciting events to celebrate and promote Fairtrade in Bristol.

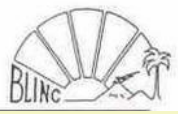


A dramatic new play that leads us from slavery, past and present, to how Fairtrade can bring about change in our trade relationships.
